Aims and activities of the organisation	<p>The SURT Foundation is a social action organization dedicated to upholding the economic, social, and cultural rights of women and eliminating gender-based discrimination, with the ultimate goal of achieving a society rooted in gender equity.</p> <p>As a women-led organization, we are deeply committed to the values of gender equity, inclusion, solidarity, and social transformation.</p> <p>While we work across various fields, our two primary areas of expertise are:</p> <p><b>1. Support Services for Recovery and Addressing Gender-Based Violence</b></p> <p>We empower women to recover from violence and regain autonomy by offering holistic support services. Key programs include:</p> <p><i>Xarxa de Mentores</i> (“Network of Mentors”): A mentoring network where survivors of gender-based violence support others in earlier recovery stages, fostering empowerment and leadership.</p> <p><i>Sirga</i>: A shelter and recovery program addressing the complex needs of women escaping violence, focusing on personalized recovery strategies and empowerment.</p> <p><i>SIADs</i> (Women’s Information and Assistance Services): Offering psychological support, legal advice, and group sessions to women and LGBTI communities across various municipalities, including El Prat, Santa Perpètua, Badalona, Salt, and others.</p> <p><i>SFC</i> (Service for Collaborative Families): A preventive resource in Barcelona providing temporary care solutions for families</p>

facing social or economic difficulties to prevent situations of irreversible risk.

*SAS* (Socio-educational Support Service): Tailored for women and trans individuals involved in sex work, focusing on social support, mediation, and access to public resources.

*SIARE* (Comprehensive Recovery and Empowerment Service): Supporting survivors of gender-based violence through psychological assistance and economic empowerment pathways to ensure full recovery.

## **2. Economic Empowerment**

We promote financial independence by enhancing professional skills, supporting access to formal labour markets, and encouraging solidarity-based economies. Key programs include:

*Obrint Portes* ("Opening doors"): Offers support for women in emerging poverty to regain autonomy through housing, legal advice, and financial guidance.

*SADI* (Support Itineraries for Migrant Women): Helps migrant women recognize their skills, understand the local labour market, and access employment through personalized pathways.

*MAIS* (Active Insertion Measures): Designed for recipients of guaranteed income, particularly women experiencing violence or caregiving responsibilities, focusing on employability and labour market reintegration.

*Dones RiU*: Supports women in rural and urban areas to improve digital literacy and access jobs in green and digital economies through tailored labor orientation pathways.

*Next Diversitat i Empresa* ("Next Diversity and Enterprise"): Aims to promote diversity in small and medium-sized enterprises while supporting vulnerable groups through diversity plans and individualized employment pathways.

Our other areas, such as community empowerment, research and digital transformation are present **cross-sectionally** through these two main areas. We also have a consultancy service specialised in the transversal application of the gender perspective. From this area we carry out training actions, equality plans, mainly for local administrations but also for universities and companies, as well as consultancy to promote policies of equality and reconciliation of work, personal and family life.
